Thank you for your request concerning Sexual Safety incidents.

Your request has been considered and processed in accordance with the requirements of the Freedom of Information (FOI) Act 2000.

1. The number of sexual safety incidents reported on in-patient wards from 2019 to the latest available month in 2023? – in each case can you specify who was affected (e.g. staff, patient etc.) and who the perpetrator was (e.g. staff, patient etc.) and specify the sex of the parties involved. Could you split the data month and year please (e.g. January 2023, February 2023 etc.)

We have applied Exemption Section 40(2) due to the small number of incidents of this type when broken down by month and year. This is because entries of 5 or less are considered sufficiently small enough to be potentially identifiable data. On this basis, this information is exempt from the duty to publish¹.

However, under Section 16 – Duty to provide Advice and Assistance we are pleased to provide you with an overall figure as detailed below with the exception of Staff on Staff incidents.

The NHS data collection was suspended from March 2020 as a result of the ongoing response to the Covid-19 pandemic but resumed from the 1st November 2021.

The Trust has provided the data for the last 3 years.

5. How many reports have been made to the police in relation to sexual safety incidents from 2019 to the latest available month in 2023? - Could you split the data month and year please (e.g. January 2023, February 2023 etc.)

Between 2019 to date there have been 10 occasions where staff have stated on our Incident Reporting system that sexual safety incidents have been reported to the police. This is where staff have ticked the option 'police called' at the time of the incident being reported. There may be further cases where police were involved at a later date but this would involve manually reading through every incident report of this nature to which would invoke Section 12 – Cost of compliance would exceeds the appropriate limit.

It is not possible to break this data down by month and year as this would result in very low numbers¹. Please see explanation given regarding low numbers under question 1.
